

discouragement, it can be stressful! In Psalm 55 and verse 6, David eluded to say "Oh that I had wings like a dove! For then would I fly away and be at rest." I won't rail on David for his honest expressions or emotions of despair and wanting to get away from it all. All of us have at one time or another been grouped into a place we desired to go away from it all. But we have learned that we can't run from life's burdens and problems. In short, when it comes to the problems of life, expect them, welcome them and encounter them victoriously through faith in God. Don't fly away from the storms; fly above the storms. Instead of asking God for wings like a dove so you can escape, ask him for wings like an eagle's! "But they that wait on the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles...." Isaiah 40:31a

When we find ourselves in a difficult situation, most of us pray "LORD, get me out of this!" If nothing happens, then quickly we pray, "Lord, when will I get out of this?" But what we ought to be praying is "Lord, what should I get out of this?" There is a purpose in our trials and even our dark days can be great teaching tools that we could learn no other way but to trust God.

"The troubles of my heart are enlarged: O bring thou me out of my distresses" (Psalms 25:17) Yes! Enlarged troubles! This was a period when David desperately needed God's direction and deliverance, while Saul was persecuting and trying to kill hm. Why does God permit enlarged troubles? Surely our Father in Heaven would want His children to be comfortable and free from afflictions.

Not so! God has never promised to make us comfortable but he has promised to make us conformable. Our Savior's purpose is that all of His children be "conformed to the image of His Son" (Romans 8:29) and in order to conform us, he must permit us to suffer. Even Jesus learned obedience through suffering (the Suffering Savior). Enlarged troubles are just the beginning.

Next, the bible says "Thou has enlarged me when I was in distress" (Psalms 4:1) Glory to God! Enlarged troubles can produce enlarged saints! I say "can produce" because troubles don't automatically produce giants. I've seen saints go through the furnace and come out "midgets". For instance, let's take King Saul and King David. These two showed the opposite effect of trials. Saul was a big man physically but a midget spiritually and his experiences in battle only made him smaller. While David may have been average in stature, he was certainly a spiritual giant. One may ask "How did he get that way? Enlarged troubles made him an enlarged saint because he trusted God. How we respond to the difficulties of life helps to determine how long God will permit them to continue. When God permits us to go into the furnace of affliction, He always keeps His eve on the clock and His hand on the thermostat. He knows how much we can take and how long the trials should last.

My wings continued...

God watches us to see if the trials are accomplishing all that they should accomplish. Enlarged troubles can lead to enlarged saints!

What is the Lord doing to lead us to the next step? "He brought me forth also into a large place." (Psalms 18:19) God uses enlarged trials to produce enlarged saints so he can put them into enlarged places. All of God's giants have been men and women who have experienced suffering in one way or another. (examples such as Joseph, Moses, Esther, Mary, etc.) Now we can better understand why David had to experience so many storms; David was chosen by God to fill a big place and David had to be enlarged, for it was the will of the Lord. Had David gotten his request, "wings like a dove" and flown away from the storm, he would have wasted all that suffering and still be unprepared for the great opportunities to serve God. Instead of getting "wings like a dove" he received "wings like an eagle" and flew right into the face of the storm and triumphed over it. But one more step remains.

"Thou hast enlarged my steps under me that my feet did not slip." Fsalms 18:36. An enlarged place can be a dangerous place for some people if they (we) don't know how to take giant steps of faith and walk with God. David's feet did not slip as Saul's did, because David had matured during the years of trials and David knew how to take giant steps of commitment to God. If we plan to walk by faith, then we must learn to take giant steps and this means we must expect difficulties. If we want to take giant steps in an enlarged place, then we must become enlarged persons; and this can be done only as we trust God in the midst of enlarged trials. The quitter gets "wings like a dove" but the winner gets "wings like an eagle". God has many enlarged places in this world that desperately need to be filled. He is looking for enlarged saints. Will you be one of them?



A simple and easy way for seniors to tone their leg muscles.

Lie flat on your back with legs extended up and toes pointed. Try to keep your hips, knees and ankles in a straight line. With your toes pointed, bend your right knee first, bringing your foot as close to your buttocks as possible. Raise your right leg to beginning position. Then repeat with your left leg. (Note, the opposite leg should be kept straight in the air, muscles tight). Now, repeat with both legs four times. Then flex the feet and repeat exercise four more times with each leg. Bring legs down and relax before standing.

(These exercises can be done on a continuing basis for firming and toning your legs.)
